

New Translation Projects


We are often discovering new materials that need to be translated such as:

From 1910 to 1932, the Cissna Park congregation used two church buildings: one in town and one in the country. In 1938, they took down the town building in sections and moved it to LaCrosse, IN, where the congregation was in need of a larger building. It took four days to ship it to its new location, and then the LaCrosse brethren rebuilt it.
