Spiritual Breadcrumbs

We recently reported that the Heritage Center is working on publishing a translation of Spiritual Breadcrumbs, Froehlich's collection of brief meditations from the years 1829 to 1831. This work was preserved in the archives of the *Evangelische Täufergemeinde* (ETG) congregation in Zurich, Switzerland. The translation and proofreading are complete and publication in a book or booklet form is planned for 2015. An excerpt from December 26, 1829, appears below:

"I speak from experience" – so say the wise of this world. They thus ascribe great importance to their experience, believing that without experience they could not speak so well on this or that. They are quick to give experience preference over mere knowledge and reasoning. And yet in exactly the most important matter of all, these men are so inconsistent that they will neither believe nor admit to a reborn child of God that the experience of Christ is higher than the mere knowledge of Christ; that one must first experience Christ before one can talk about Him, and that there can be absolutely no confession of Christ without the living experience of Christ in one's own heart! I must confess that I did not know Christ before I had experienced Him full of grace and truth.

Froehlich's Meditations on Romans - Translation Project

One of the primary purposes of the Heritage Center is to preserve and make available historical material for the benefit of present and future generations of all those who are currently attending a Froehlich church or are interested in the doctrine of true faith rekindled by Bro. Samuel Froehlich. The Heritage Center feels that Bro. Froehlich's meditations, though not to supersede the Holy Scriptures, provide valuable insight into the understanding given to him by the Holy Spirit as he was led to come out of the State Church and preach a doctrine of a true rebirth and a consecrated life of service and righteousness towards God. His meditations on the book of Romans are not found in the set of Froehlich books currently available. We believe the translation of additional Froehlich material runs to the core of the purpose of the Heritage Center and can yet be helpful to issues and questions that arise in our day and time.

Consider the following excerpt taken from the first 43 pages which have been finished thus far:

November 3, 1844 Romans 1:9 etc.

Afternoon meeting: Paul worked to spread the Gospel, save the lost, and edify and strengthen those who were saved both near and far, partly by his supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgiving for all saints and for all men and partly by preaching the Gospel. He had such a widespread and powerful effect because he served God in the Spirit with his spirit because he clung to God and did not just do an outward work, which many others also did for appearance's sake, yet they accomplished nothing for the Kingdom of God and for the salvation of souls.

Paul's desire to go to Rome was based on:

- 1. The wish to impart more spiritual gifts to those who already believed and to assist in their edification in the Spirit because this godly work is not finished quickly. Where there is no growth, there is a going backwards in grace, and a great many circumstances in this world encourage this retreat so that our zeal for the Lord and our diligence in holiness and love for the brethren might grow cold by being tempted to be lazy and worldly. A single careless, drowsy member in the congregation of Christ spoils more than three zealous ones can accomplish. Therefore, Paul wished that all might show exactly the same zeal (Hebrews 6:11).
- 2. His desire to win and save still more lost souls in Rome by preaching the Gospel of Christ. The same Spirit of Christ works in His messengers and servants both the salvation of the lost and the preservation and growth of those who are saved, for what good is a good beginning without a good ending? The Apostle was interested in much fruit in his service in the Gospel of Christ so that many might be converted from the power of Satan unto God. Today we can accomplish little in this respect because men believe that they already are Christians before they have become Christians by the seed of the apostolic teaching and preaching. Therefore, they consider all to be deceivers and false teachers who would first like to work toward the conversion of lost sinners and carnally-minded men so that they might later become Christians and children of God.

The meditations on Romans consists of 250 pages of text and the cost to carefully translate the remaining pages will likely exceed \$15,000. Do you know...

Bro. Samuel Froehlich was baptized in 1832. By 1850, he had established 55 churches. After only 30 years of preaching, there were over 100 congregations.

This new faith began in Hungary in 1840 with the baptism of Bro. Louis Hencsey. By 1900 there were 236 churches in Hungary.

The true faith spread to America in 1847, and the churches at Croghan and Naumberg, NY, were started. By 1870 there were 24 churches established. An additional 21 congregations were begun by 1900.
