## Precursor to the *Zion's Harp* Donated

Recently an old hymnal was donated to the Heritage Center. Glancing inside it, we were excited to realize we had a hymnal used by Froehlich congregations that predates our beloved *Zion's Harp* hymnal! It is divided into multiple sections: one is the *Christliche Harmonica*, one is the *Lieder für Kinder*, and another includes various other songs we know from the *Zion's Harp*. A handwritten poem in the book is dated 1853.

A book detailing the history of the *Zion's Harp* and including historical information about the authors and composers of each hymn should be available by mid-December.





### New Songs for Youth Hymnal

This hymnal includes the hymns from the *Lieder für Kinder* which was used as a source hymnal for our *Zion's Harp.* The 15 songs originally in this "Songs for Children" collection are relatively musically simple with words applicable even to young children. A few other songs from other hymnals of our heritage (the *Heft* and the *Alte Lieder*) have been added as well.

### **A Selection From History**

The following words were spoken by Bro. Silas Leuthold from Princeville, IL, on January 16, 1960, at a funeral in West Bend, IA:

It is a depressing and deplorable thing to think, when we read the parables that Jesus Christ left for us, that even those who have lived in the world without a great spot of sin resting upon them, but just never concern themselves too much of complying with the way that God prescribed for eternal life. I believe that is the meaning of the ten virgins, five were wise and five were foolish. The wise virgin provided for her lamp the oil that was required that she might see and that she might give light unto others, but the foolish came empty handed. They had nothing to offer, and then the door was shut. Yet they were virgins; we read not of any sin they were involved in, but they were simply careless in going through life. And the Word of God is so clear and plain; it prescribes the way that we should walk. It is a way that is somewhat narrow; it has sometimes a steep hill or incline that we must climb; there are boulders and stones in the way, and often thorns that become somewhat a hindrance and a handicap. Yet if we faithfully walk, as we were reminded in the reading of the virtuous woman, who walked so faithfully and concerned herself that she might provide for her household faithfully and also for her salvation, that is what you and I shall want to have done when we meet our God at the end of life's journey.

Have we kept faith? Have we sought the Lord and found Him? If so we have the assurance in our hearts, a living hope that no one can take from us. The Lord already gave us that assurance that Satan will not be able to rob us, neither will the thieves be able to break in and steal, neither moth or rust destroy it. It will be treasures in Heaven.
